



## **Guidelines for Curriculum Plan RWI Fellowship 2015**

The human rights training/workshop curriculum plan is a key part of your application to the RWI Fellowship programme and needs to be submitted together with your application form. The main purpose of the curriculum plan is to describe your proposed research and human rights training/workshop, stating its importance and how it will be conducted. Please keep in mind that what you describe in the plan should describe the development of a curriculum that will be implemented upon return to your home institution. The plan should not describe an already existing training curriculum or an already implemented training. The curriculum plan should be max **3 pages** long and include the following parts:

### **1. Title**

### **2. Introduction**

Here you should briefly introduce the topic of your training, explain why you have selected this topic and specify the objectives of your training plan. In other words, you should briefly describe what the training will be about, why it is relevant and important, and what you aim to achieve. You should also provide information on the target group(s) of your training.

### **3. Training objectives**

In this section you should describe in detail the main outcomes of your proposed training. What exactly is it that you want the target group to have learned after having participated in the training? What kind of change in human rights capacity do you want your training to lead to? How are these objectives related to the needs of your institution?

### **4. Methods**

Here you should explain how you will carry out your training. What kind of different teaching and learning methods do you anticipate utilizing in order to achieve your training objectives?

### **5. Research**

Here you should describe what kind of research you need to carry out in order to plan, develop and implement your training. What kind of human rights knowledge do you need to improve in order to carry out your training?
